

Curriculum Requirements

- English (500 hours)

- Music (100 hours by the end of Year 8)
- TAS (200 hours by the end of Year 8)
- Languages (100 hours by the end of Year 8)
- Electives (400 Hours)

Requirements for Award of the Record of School Achievement (RoSA)

To qualify for the award of a RoSA, a student must have:

- attended an accredited school;
- undertaken and completed courses of study as outlined on the previous slide;
- complied with any other regulations or requirements (such as attendance) imposed by the Minister or NESA; and
- completed Year 10.

Grading

- The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content in addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills etc.
- The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills.
- The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.
- The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.
- The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

Working toward your HSC


- The only compulsory subject in the HSC is 2 units of English.
- With the exception of Continuers Languages, all HSC courses start in Year 11.
- All students must also attain a minimum standard in Reading and Numeracy.
- Our best HSC results are from students who follow their passions.
