

Co-Curricular Visual Arts



At Caringbah High School, we pride ourselves on celebrating the Creative Arts and providing unique opportunities for our students. The Visual Arts department offers many extra curricular activities to extend students creatively. We run 'Mural Club', competitions, exhibitions and opportunities for our students to participate in public art projects in the community, such as the redesign of the Tonkin Underpass and Art Cube exhibition at Cronulla.

During our '**Open Lunchtimes**', students can access the Visual Arts studios to work on their artworks, including school works, self-initiated projects, and murals, all under the guidance of specialised Visual Arts teachers.

Forming in 2018, our '**Mural Club**' has been responsible for beautifying the school grounds, having completed three site-specific artworks so far. Our Club consists of students, from Years 7 - 12. They are responsible for identifying sites within the school and then coming up with design concepts and installation. Our first and largest mural, located in the school carpark, was completed in collaboration with renowned Australian street artist, Phibs, who was one of the main artists involved with Sutherland Shire Council's inaugural initiative, *Walk The Walls* Caringbah in 2018.

In addition to our in-school programs, we also regularly promote upcoming art, video and photography competitions, both internal and external, and support students through the submission process. Some competitions our students have been involved in include Operation Art, Young Archies and Videos For Change.
