



CHS Late Arrival Expectations and Consequences

Late Arrival

The NSW Department of Education *Behaviour Code for Students* states that students are expected to attend school everyday unless unwell, and to “arrive to school and class on time”.

To this end, students should ensure they manage their transportation to school in such a manner as to arrive before their first lesson at 8.50am. Every now and then students might have transportation issues such as a late bus or train, or heavy traffic, but this is a rarity and will not be an acceptable excuse for persistent lateness. Students should ensure they leave home with enough time to arrive at school before 8.50am.

Behaviour/Level Sequence

Five incidents of late to school	Email to parents and students After school detention
An additional five incidents of late arrival to school	Level 2 for persistent non-compliant behaviour * Email to parents and students

*Please note, Level 2 consequences include the student being unable to represent the school or attend excursions for 25 school days. Please see the CHS Behaviour Support and Management Plan for further details.
