



CHS Uniform Expectations and Consequences

Uniform

The NSW Department of Education *Behaviour Code for Students* states: In NSW public schools, students are expected to meet the school's agreed uniform policy or dress code. To meet this expectation, the Behaviour Code states that students should adhere to the principle to dress appropriately by wearing school uniform every day.

To this end, students should ensure they manage their school uniform items so they always have the correct uniform available each day. Please note: laundry issues are not a valid excuse for persistent non-compliance with uniform requirements.

During cold weather only the appropriate CHS jumper, cardigan or blazer may be worn, with the blazer being the outer garment for Years 7 and 8. Students are encouraged to layer their CHS uniform items in very cold weather. Hoodies and other non CHS regulation jumpers or pullovers are not permitted.

Students should bring their school uniform with them to change into if they have training for a sports team during the day.

Behaviour/Level Sequence

Five incidents of being out of school uniform per calendar year	Email to parents and student After school detention
An additional five incidents of being out of school uniform per calendar year	Level 2 for persistent non-compliant behaviour* Email to parents and students

*Please note, Level 2 consequences include the student being unable to represent the school or attend excursions for 25 school days. Please see the CHS Behaviour Support and Management Plan for further details.
